Anastasia's Story

Bringing love in a shoebox!

Anastasia is 93. Along with her husband and three children, she was taken prisoner by the Nazis during World War II. the family lived out the war in enforced labour, working in a German munitions factory / prison. The family's food was just above starvation level. Post war, the family was released and made their way back to their home town in Belarus. Nothing remained. Their village was levelled and its occupants disappeared. No relatives, neighbours or friends were ever found.

Only one of her children is still living. Her 70 year old daughter is now her carer. For the past 5 years Anastasia has been bedridden and responds to no one but her daughter.

We took 5 flights of stairs to reach her apartment, there was no lift. We sang an Irish song and gave her a Shoebox Gift. She couldn't believe that we had travelled all this way from Ireland.

At first the tears ran down her cheeks but they were soon replaced by a big broad grin of delight that you can see in the photo above.
